

Ross Levine

James and Merryl Tisch Professor of Economics, Brown University

Ross Levine is the James and Merryl Tisch Professor of Economics at Brown University and Director of the William R. Rhodes Center for International Economics and Finance. He is a Research Associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER), Editor of the *Journal of Financial Intermediation*, and an Associate Editor at both the *Journal of Economic Growth* and the *Journal of Development Economics*.

Ross Levine received his Ph.D. in Economics from UCLA in 1987. After working at the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for three years, Dr. Levine moved to the World Bank, where he managed research and operational programs. In 1997, Dr. Levine joined the University of Virginia, before moving to the University of Minnesota in 1999, and then to Brown University in 2005.

Professor Levine's work focuses on the linkages between financial sector policies, the operation of financial systems, and the functioning of the economy. His book, *Rethinking Bank Regulation: Till Angels Govern,* challenges current approaches to the regulation of banks.
