David N. Weil is Professor of Economics at Brown University and a Research Associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER) and Brown's Population Studies Training Center. He received his B.A. in History from Brown University in 1982 and his Ph.D. in Economics from Harvard University in 1990. He has written widely on various aspects of economic growth including cross-country empirics, accumulation of human and physical capital, appropriate technology, fertility, habit formation, and health, as well as on such non-growth topics as demographic economics, social security, monetary policy, and portfolio allocation. He is also the author of an undergraduate textbook on economic growth. He has held visiting faculty positions at Harvard University and the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, and has served on the editorial boards of the *American Economic Review* and *Journal of Economic Growth*. He is currently a member of the Development Policy Council of the Swedish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and co-director of the NBER project on the "Causes of African Development Successes".
